

Congratulations to Vanderbilt's Center for Cognitive Medicine (CCM) on being named an Alzheimer's Clinical Trials Consortium (ACTC) Member Site. Member Sites represent the top experts in the field at academic centers across the US.

The ACTC Member Site designation is given to sites who conduct high integrity clinical trials in Alzheimer's disease and Alzheimer's disease related dementias (ADRD), with an emphasis on enrolling participants who are historically underrepresented in ADRD research.

The ACTC award provides infrastructure support for staff; Site PI's are recognized as voting members of the ACTC Steering committee; and site staff have the opportunity and access to an array of resources and committee involvement opportunities, intended to enhance the quality of trial conduct for individual investigators, sites, and the network overall.

CCM is an interdisciplinary center focused on understanding the cognitive basis for neuropsychiatric disorders and developing therapeutic strategies to enhance brain and cognitive function and improve quality of life. Investigators conduct research and treatment studies that focus on the brain and disorders of memory, mood, thinking, development and aging. A major focus of CCM is on the development of therapeutic treatments for Alzheimer's disease. Additionally, they offer a free Memory Screening Program.
